Good Performances by Cammeray Members

- Peter Landrebe and Alan Walsh both played in the ACA Bronze Medal – an invitation event for the top ten players in NSW. Peter ran out the winner, and will now play in the ACA Gold Medal against other state winners. Alan won 5 of his 9 matches, and narrowly missed out on second place. Alan's handicap is now down to $-1/2$.
- Bebe Abdullah won the NSW Bronze Singles at Tempe, winning 5 of her 6 games, pegging out in all 5 games, and reducing her handicap to 18 in the process.
- Barbara McDonald came second in the NSW Silver Singles at Tempe, winning 4 of her 6 games, and pegging out in all 4 games. A remarkable effort giving that she was suffering a rather bad dose of the 'flu at the time, kindly brought back from Adelaide for her by Alan Walsh.
- Stephen Howes played in the Wagga Wagga Handicap tournament in October and won his block unbeaten.

Stephen reports *"Amongst my opponents were Jim Nicholls (2 handicap, Wagga) and John Cook (2, Bathurst). The game against Jim was particularly close as I had stupidly played my first ball to the peg and Jim quickly pegged it out. It wasn't until time was called with me on strike that the game turned my way – Jim had left a ball within roqueting distance for the first time. Roquet completed, I ran 5, 6, 1-back and 2-back with those two balls to equal the score, then managed to run 3-back. I lay up and Jim missed. A 1 point victory!*

Croquet people everywhere are very welcoming and Wagga club is no different; I will be going back next year. Would anyone like to join me?"

- Lesley Fransen won the Silver Singles Makara event played at Strathfield Club after winning the Bronze /Silver Doubles event with her partner from Marrickville Club, Margaret Stapleton. The silver doubles was played at Marrickville Club the week before.

Lesley's last game of the Silver Singles Makara event was played in 38 degree heat on Melbourne Cup Day. In her final game it came down to a match point between Ros Johnstone and Lesley and "luckily" Ros missed the first go at the hoop and Lesley was able to overcome the nerves and take out the winning point. Over the whole competition Lesley won all her games.

Lesley reports *"When I got home I collapsed with heat exhaustion having failed to put on the air-conditioning in my car on the drive home (passing through Rhodes the temperature reached 41 degrees by the car thermostat) which prolonged the day in the "sun/heat". I definitely had a fuddled brain after concentrating so hard in my last game!"*

- John Fransen came 2nd to John Eddes in the Makara Golf Croquet Gold Singles. His greatest achievements in the event were his scoring hoop 4 from the north boundary and hoop 5 from the south boundary at a 30 degree angle.

Cammeray Summertime Tournament

This tournament has now been played for five weeks, and has good support from bronze level players. For many members this has been the first opportunity for handicap play, particularly full bisque handicap play. The experience of playing with bisques available (and against opponents with bisques available) is very valuable for a player's croquet development, and you are encouraged to come along if you haven't tried it already. There is no handicap limit, and games are full bisque with a base handicap of 11, with 2/3 of the normal bisques available to allow for the shortened time limit of 2 hours.

Two players (Bebe Abdullah and David Surridge) are undefeated at the moment.

The tournament will continue on Tuesday evenings until the end of daylight saving, with a break over Christmas/New Year. Bookings are available on the website two weeks in advance, and full details are on the News page of the website.

Twilight Games

During daylight saving, our popular twilight games are being held on Monday evenings from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. followed by wine and cheese and scintillating conversation. The first two Twilight events were washed out by some much needed rain, but the series eventually got under way on 2 November with eight players.
