Although he was Dux of Fort St he did not go on to university, but to work at MLC Assurance Co where he was one of the very early programmers for their new IBM machines. At the same time he started work on his Actuarial exams by correspondence with the Institute of Actuaries in London. He qualified in 1962 and was later to move into management. At the ripe old age of 55 he retired to concentrate on what he loved most---playing sport and travelling. He was an accomplished tennis player, golfer, and was working on croquet when his balance problems led him to give it away before he was able to reach proficiency. Becoming housebound he turned his attention to his other love - contract bridge. He and two of his long time partners, Tom Goodyer and Roger Januszke played bridge online most days.
